Citizen's Surveillance FAQ

What equipment do I need to begin rooting out Terror Suspects?

Many Canadians think that covert surveillance requires an expensive array of high-tech listening devices, miniature cameras, truth serums, and so on. The truth is that good-old-fashioned observation, along with some occasional eaves-dropping, is entirely adequate for most purposes. Furthermore, due to Canada's **Insecurity Certificate™** procedures, painstaking documentation of evidence is superfluous. All evidence is sealed – forever. So keep things simple: you tell us what you know and we'll take your word for it.

Where should I begin to look for Terror Suspects?

In today's terror-ridden world, Terror Suspects can be found in virtually any setting. At work, on street corners, in public lavatories, etc. You may even be an unwitting *Terror Suspect* yourself.

How do I evaluate my checklist and what should I do when I make a positive identification?

Evaluation of the checklist is easy: answering 'YES' to three or more questions means you have positively identified a *Terror Suspect*. Complete the form below and mail this information to CSIS to collect your incentive program points (warning: under Canada's Anti-Terrorism Act, a person who witholds information about a *Terror Suspect* will be detained as a *Terror Suspect* themselves and their incentive points will be rendered null and void).
